Kato, Francisco Ordóñez, 2016-10-26 Recent trends in syntax and morphology have shown the great importance of doing research on variation in closely related languages This book centers on the study of the morphology and syntax of the two major Romance Languages spoken in Latin America from this perspective The works presented here either compare Brazilian Portuguese with European Portuguese or compare Latin American Spanish and Peninsular Spanish or simply compare Portuguese and its varieties with Spanish and its varieties The chapters advance on a great variety of theoretical questions related to coordination clitics hyper raising infinitives null objects null subjects hyper raising passives quantifiers pseudo clefts questions and distributed morphology Finally this book provides new empirical findings and enriches the descriptions made about Portuguese and Spanish Spoken in the Americas by providing new generalizations new data and new statistical evidence that help better understand the nature of such variation The studies contained in this book show a vast array of new phenomena in these young varieties offering empirical and theoretical windows to language variation and change

From fieldwork to linguistic theory Edward Gibson, Moshe Poliakov, 2024-09-25 Dan Everett is a renowned linguist with an unparalleled breadth of contributions ranging from fieldwork to linguistic theory including phonology morphology syntax semantics sociolinguistics psycholinguistics historical linguistics philosophy of language and philosophy of linguistics Born on the U S Mexican border Daniel Everett faced much adversity growing up and was sent as a missionary to convert the Pirah in the Amazonian jungle a group of people who speak a language that no outsider had been able to become proficient in Although no Pirah person was successfully converted Everett successfully learned and studied Pirah as well as multiple other languages in the Americas Ever steadfast in pursuing data driven language science Everett debunked generativist claims about syntactic recursion for which he was repeatedly attacked In addition to conducting fieldwork with many understudied languages and revolutionizing linguistics Everett has published

multiple works for the general public Don't sleep there are snakes Language The cultural tool and how language began This book is a collection of 15 articles that are related to Everett's work over the years released after a tribute event for Dan Everett that was held at MIT on June 8th 2023

Focus-related Operations at the Right Edge in Spanish Iván Ortega-Santos, 2016-05-11 Syntactic movement is a pervasive phenomenon in natural language and as such has played a key role in syntactic theorizing Nonetheless an understanding of the mechanism that allows a constituent to appear to the right of its base-generated position has remained elusive This groundbreaking research monograph aims to address this gap in our knowledge by expanding the inventory of languages and data sets traditionally considered in the literature Specifically Ortega Santos analyzes the interplay between focus word order and ellipsis in Spanish A major finding that emerges from the analysis is that the tension between linearization requirements and rightward movement is diminished by ellipsis Current debates on the syntax of the VOS order and preverbal subjects in Null Subject Languages also figure prominently in the discussion as novel empirical evidence for the existence of null expletives is provided a non-trivial issue for our understanding of the Extended Projection Principle and subjecthood across languages

Agreement, case and locality in the nominal and verbal domains Ludovico Franco, Mihaela Marchis Moreno, Matthew Reeve, 2019-11-14 This book explores the Agree operation and its morphological realisations agreement and case specifically focusing on the connection between Agree and other syntactic dependencies such as movement binding and control The chapters in this volume examine a diverse set of cross-linguistic phenomena involving agreement and case from a variety of theoretical perspectives with a view to elucidating the nature of the abstract operations that underlie them The phenomena discussed include backward control passivisation progressive aspectual constructions extraction from nominals possessives relative clauses and the phasal status of PPs

Minimalist Essays on Brazilian Portuguese Syntax Jairo Nunes, 2009 This collection of papers discusses some of the major syntactic properties of Brazilian Portuguese from a minimalist perspective The volume focuses on movement and empty category issues and brings new empirical material on a variety of topics null subjects and finite control possessive and existential constructions factive constructions relative clauses null objects and stress shift preposition duplication VP topicalization and ellipsis The book is of interest to a wide spectrum of linguists working on theoretical and comparative syntax

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
